
# Let's find those artifacts!

The Historical Society was pleased to host a presentation by the Casco Bay Archeology Project on March 19th at the Island Hall as a follow-up to last summer's meeting concerning indigenous artifacts. The Project's founders, Thomas Bennett and Nathan Hamilton, announced that plans are underway for a field school on Little Chebeague next fall and that during the summer they will be evaluating previously identified sites on Chebeague. Representatives of the Project will be in contact with landowners of prospective sites. Several Chebeaguers brought in artifacts that had been found near their homes. One arrowhead was identified as having been created 3,600 to 3,800 years before the present day! This was a great discovery! The boat house pictured here no longer stands. It is possible that some of the foundation rubble exists. The path to the shore is referenced on deeds to an unregistered cottage subdivision.
