**Digital Video Art Show Projected on Six-Story exterior wall of Cousins Island Power Plant**

**Friday, August 24 from 8:00pm -9:00pm; the rain/fog date Saturday, August 25**

The Maine Center for Creativity has received permission from FPL Energy to project new media art images onto the front wall of the Cousins Island Power Plant. This arts and industry event, called "Light House", is a collaborative community project, meant to bring attention to the importance of new media arts and the growth of creative industries in Maine. The town of Yarmouth, the town of Falmouth, FPL Energy, WCLZ radio 98.9FM and the volunteers of the Maine Center for Creativity have worked together to share this new generation of art with the public.

On Friday, August 24 from 8:00 –9:00pm, artist, Raphael DiLuzio, will be creating intriguing video images, best described as "video paintings" which will be projected by a 12,000 lumens projector and stand approximately 63 feet wide by 36 feet high on the front side of the Cousins Island Power Plant. The work can be viewed from land and from boats. Bring strong binoculars for the best view from wherever you can see the Cousins Island Power Plant. To enhance the art experience tune into WCLZ 98.9FM at 8:00pm to hear the original music which accompanies the visual images.

Raphael DiLuzio, an artist and professor at the University of Maine at Orono, has recently exhibited and performed similar works at the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the Gallerie Caprice Horn in Berlin, Germany, Domus Artium in Salamanca Spain and K@2 Media Center in Krosta, Latvia. He has been experimenting with live video performance and time-based paintings since 1999. His 20-minute piece, entitled "Light House", will be an exciting montage of original footage mixed with bits of classic cinema centered around themes of water, flight, romance and technology. *The show will loop three times so it will run for approximately one hour. Each loop will be a unique experience as the artist continues to evolve the piece. The show will start at 8:00pm.
