- All SS instructors were US Sailing certified

Membership:

- suggestions:
 - somehow increase the YC group dynamics...which is increasingly difficult given the Island wide increase in fundraisers and events.
 - Have a small boat only race to encourage the younger sailors as well as SS students and instructors.

Suggestions for SS:

- Increase in SS course fee to cover SS expenses
- Incentive to have them become members for SS enrollment, even if the membership fee is offset by the discount
- Getting students from Long Island or Cliff to take courses

- A small float for the boats to come up on regardless of tide (would be easier on the boats)
- Consider development of an 'Opti Fleet'.
